Message from Executive Director

In 2017, we are seeing declines in gross gaming revenue (GGR) in the north and central regions (as noted right) with the Gulf Coast holding steady down less than through Q3. Overall, GGR for the state is down 2.4% while visitation is slightly down as well. We will see how Q4 shapes up, but the declines seem to indicate that visitors are spending less. As we enter Q4, we look ahead to the 2018 Legislative Session kicking off January 2. On January 24, we will roll out MGHA's 2018 Annual Report. The same day, we will co-host the MTA/ MGHA Legislative Reception at the South (in Jackson). Next, looking down the road to May, we are Rebooting Southern Gaming Summit. Also, we expect to know how the U.S. Supreme Court will rule on PASPA. To say the least, the next few months promise to be very busy and very interesting.



The declines in gross gaming revenue continue in the river regions with the North experiencing a 4.3% decline in GGR during Q3 (down 4.7% for the year) and the Central region experiencing a 1.4% decline in GGR during Q3 (down 3.2% for the year). The Coast saw a slight increase in GGR during the quarter and is down less than 1% YTD. Through Q3, total GGR for the state is down 2.4%. By comparison, visits from out-ofstate are down 3%.



Visitation through the Q3 shows slight declines in visitation from AL and AR and slight increases in visitors from LA and TN. Visitors from key states like FL, GA and TX are holding steady.

Rebooting Southern Gaming Summit in 2018

On August 9, 2017, MGHA acquired 100% ownership of Southern Gaming Summit (SGS). Since then, MGHA has been working behind the scenes to come up with what SGS will look like in 2018. MGHA decided it is time to refresh SGS and, in 2018, MGHA is Rebooting Southern Gaming Summit. As part of SGS 2018, MGHA will add a dinner banquet honoring the Mississippians and others who have contributed so much to the Mississippi gaming industry. The nomination process will begin in January 2018 and the SGS 2018 website will go live in

January as well.

Sports Betting — Mississippi is Poised and Ready

As the United States Supreme Court hears oral arguments about the constitutionality of the Professional & Amateur Sports Protection Act ("PASPA"), Mississippi stands poised and ready to begin offering sports betting at casinos should PASPA be found unconstitutional or limited so as not to interfere with a state's right to regulate these activities. In 2017, the Mississippi legislature made two small changes to the Gaming Control Act (effective July 1, 2017) clearing the path for Race Book and Sports Pool in Mississippi casinos. If the Supreme Court overturns or restricts PASPA or if Congress takes action before the court rules, Mississippi operators will seek permission to operate these games on their casino floors. It is expected that offering these games at casinos will draw more visitors to Mississippi. Also, it is expected this could greatly reduce illegal sports betting taking place around the state.

The Lottery and VLTs — Where do we stand?

Most people think of lottery as traditional lottery tickets like PowerBall® and MegaMillions® and perhaps even scratch cards. The Mississippi Legislature has been studying the lottery since the summer, and it is expected that some bills will be introduced during the upcoming 2018 legislative session by those seeking to authorize a lottery. However, with a lottery bill comes the likelihood of Video Lottery Terminals (VLTs) and other versions of the lottery that are unlike traditional lottery tickets. MGHA addressed its concerns about VLTs and other non-traditional forms of the lottery in its letter dated November 16, 2017, that our Executive Director presented on the same date to the House Lottery Working Group. 
USM Offers Casino Management
